

Federation's Prime Minister Meets with Ambassador of Japan

Prime Minister of the Federation of BiH Fadil Novalic and Ambassador of Japan to BiH Kazuya Ogawa met at the headquarters of Federation's government in Sarajevo and discussed cooperation between the two countries and possibility of expanding it

Prime Minister thanked for assistance of Government of Japan for rehabilitation of BiH, especially in reconstruction and building of road infrastructure. According to Ambassador Ogawa, Japan is one of the biggest donors in BiH and is still trying to help BiH in many sectors. Since the end of war, Japan has invested approximately one billion KM in BiH. Japanese diplomat congratulated the Federation Prime Minister on successful implementation of reform projects, especially the adoption of the new Law on Labor. Next year is the 20th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Japan and BiH. They assessed that is another occasion for strengthening bilateral cooperation, firstly in economic sector.

Representatives of the International Community and the BiH authorities will take part today in a memorial ceremony at Prokosko Lake, near Fojnica. The ceremony

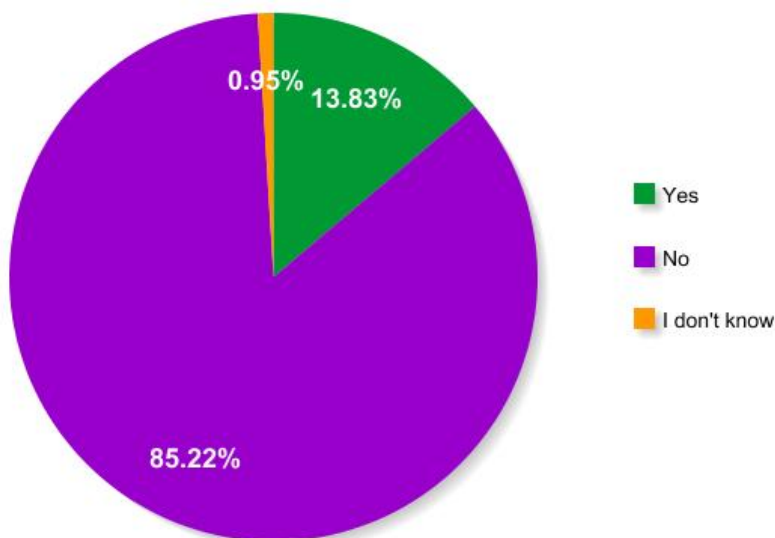
will mark the eighteenth anniversary of the helicopter crash in which seven staff members of former UNMIBH and five OHR staff members were killed.
